Antique Organic Apples

33338-Belle de Booskop- \$32.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Belle de Boskoop was introduced in the 1850s in the Netherlands. Large, greenish yellow fruit with dark red blush. Rough skin. Crisp, tangy, highly aromatic flesh. Outstanding for dessert, cooking an baking. It works equally well in a savory salad, or can be used sliced in continental-style apple pies and flans Sweetens in storage. Excellent keeper. Needs a pollinator. Ripens in November or December.

33340 –Golden Russet- \$32.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Considered the champagne of old time cider apples. Medium size fruit. Gray-green to golden bronze with a coppery orange cheek; heavily splotched with light brown russet. Crisp, highly flavored fine textured, yellow flesh. Very sugary juice. Used for cider, dried apples, fresh eating and cooking. Excellent keeper; under proper moisture conditions will keep from December until April. Vigorous, medium to large tree; often a tip bearer. Requires cross-pollination. Scab resistant; suffers little from pests. Ripens late in October.

33342 –Hauer Pippin- \$32.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

California 1890’s. Seedling of Cox’s Orange Pippin with the same fine flavor. Still grown commercially. Russeted, green, thick skin. Good keeper. Well suited for shipping. Very good for fresh eating, hard cider, cooking, apple sauce, apple butter. Ripens from November to December. Stays on the tree through December. Requires pollenizer.

33344 –Pink Sparkle- \$32.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Distinctive upside down shape, broad base narrow at the stem. Develops a res striped skin when ripe, flesh is deep pink, but varies according to climate. Tart, mildly sweet with distinctive aromatic flavor. Excellent for fresh eating, dessert, cooking (puree, applesauce, apple butter. Requires pollinator. Found in an old orchard near Whale Gulch, California.

33346 –Roxbury Russet- \$32.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Excellent old American cider apple. Large fruit. Greenish, sometimes bronze tinged skin almost covered with yellowish brown russet. Firm, slightly coarse, fairly tender, yellowish white flesh. Remarkable for its amount of sugar. Good for eating fresh or cooking; excellent for cider. Notable keeper until April or May. Ripens in mid October.

Apples Semi-Dwarf

13475-Akane- \$23.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Especially fine red dessert apple derived from Jonathan. Sweet, rich, spicy flavor-well-regarded by apple connoisseurs. resists scab and powdery mildew. Harvest in early season (August). Pollenizer required: Fuji, Gala, Granny Smith, Golden Delicious.

13495-Ashmead's Kernel-\$23.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Widely regarded as one of the all-time best-flavored apples. Small to medium-sized fruit; variable shape, often lop-sided. Greenish to golden brown russet skin with reddish highlights. Creamy yellow flesh is aromatic, crisp and sweet. Fruit picked early is somewhat sharp and acidic, but mellows after a few weeks off the tree. Ripens after Red Delicious, about with Golden Delicious. Keeps 3-4 months. Used for dessert, cider and sauce. Resistant to powdery mildew, somewhat resistant to apple scab. Winter hardy tree, begins bearing at young age. From England, discovered in the early 1700s. Partly self-fruitful, biggest crops with cross-pollination.

13510-Cox Orange Pippin-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Old favorite dessert apple: firm, juicy, sweet, rich flavor, not tart, distinctive aroma. Skin is orange-red to bright red over yellow. Midseason. Self-fruitful.

13530-Fuji \$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Recent introduction from Japan that quickly became California's favorite apple. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin, sometimes russeted. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollenizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

13520-Fuji, Red \$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Redder-skinned bud sport of Fuji. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Ripe September-October in Central Calif. Excellent pollenizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

98808-Gala-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Wonderful desert apple from New Zealand. Crisp, nice blend of sweetness and tartness, rich flavor. Skin reddish-orange over yellow. Early harvest. Good pollenizer for other

varieites. Adapted to cold and warm-winter climates. Self-fruitful.

13555-Golden Delicious -\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Longtime favorite for its sweetness and flavor. Reliable producer, adapted to many climates. Pollenizer for Red Delicious. Mid-season harvest (September in Central Calif.). Self-fruitful.

10010-Granny Smith-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Large, waxy, grass-green fruit; firm and bruise resistant. Hardy, crisp, juicy, white flesh. Moderately sweet, snappy flavor. Superb eating and cooking qualities. Keeps good texture during baking; never gets mushy. Keeps 180 days in cold storage. Good shelf life. Very vigorous; annual and early bearing. Strong grower and tip bearer; very heavy producer. Self-fertile. Unusually long season; harvest 170-190 days after full bloom. Holds well in heat.

13575-Gravenstein-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Famous for sauce and baking, also used fresh. Crisp, juicy, flavorful, tart. Early bloom, early harvest. Green with red stripes. Pollen-sterile, pollenizer required: Empire, Fuji, Gala, Red Delicious.

27722-Honeycrisp-\$24.99

Rootstock: M111

Fruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

83037-Hudson's Golden Gem-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

One of the best flavored russet apples. Crisp, sugary, juicy flesh with flavor described as nutty by some and pear like by others. Smooth, uniform light yellow russet. Good keeper, and disease resistant. Partially self-fruitful, better with a pollinator.

13600-King, Thompkins-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Large, old-time red-striped apple with classic apple flavor. Its coarse, crisp flesh is subacid, sweet and distinctly perfumed. Used for dessert, cooking and cider. Well-colored fruits are a very attractive red with some contrasting yellow. Fairly rectangular shape, with ribs near the base. Ripens mid-season, about with Golden Delicious. Keeps several months, but at its best soon after harvest. Horizontal limbs, spreading growth habit. Originated in New Jersey prior to 1804. Sterile pollen; cross-pollination required.

13605-Liberty -\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Disease-resistant, cold hardy apple. Resists scab, rust, mildew, fireblight. Solid red even in hot climate. Crisp, rich sprightly flavor. Fresh or cooked. Early fall harvest. Interfruitful with Red Delicious, Empire, McIntosh. Self-fruitful.

13615-Mutsu-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Golden Delicious x Indo. Yellow Delicious type. Large, round, yellow fruit. Crunchier flesh; more juice and tartness. Distinctive, delicate spicy flavor; faintly anise-like. Good dessert and processing apple. Applesauce and cider. Great keeper (till March). Susceptible to scab. Needs pollinator. Ripens during October

13625-Pink Lady (Cripps Pink)-\$25.99

Rootstock: M111

New hot climate apple from Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet-tart, distinct flavor, good keeper. Skin reddish-pink over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. Harvest begins late October in Central CA, about three weeks after Fuji. Self-fruitful.

27726-Pink Pearl-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Pink fleshed variety developed from Surprise, which was first noted in England in 1831. Medium size apple with attractive cream and green skin, sometimes blushed with red cheek. Novel, bright pink flesh, rich sweet flavor, fine aroma. Good dessert quality; makes colorful applesauce or pie. Blooms early with a profusion of crimson pink blossoms. Requires pollinator. Developed by California apple breeder, Albert Etter. Introduced in 1944.

98817- Pippin, Yellow Newton \$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Large fruit with crisp, firm flesh. Very tart flavor. Excellent for cooking, eating fresh and cider. Self Fertile. Ripens in October.

33350-Sundowner \$25.99

Rootstock: M111

An actual "Pink Lady" sibling, hybridized by the same grower using the same parents. Red fruit with crispy, sweet, white flesh. Long shelf life. Vigorous, upright tree tends toward biennial bearing. Matures up to two weeks after Granny Smith. Sundowner is better grown inland ripening better in hotter climates. Best with pollenizer.

98814-Waltana-\$23.99

Rootstock: M111

Medium to large fruit of variable shape. Thin red striping over greenish background.

Often picked on the green side and ripened in storage. Crisp, hard, yet juicy texture. Vigorous and productive. Ripens in November here on the coast. Al Albert Etter variety named for Albert's brother, Walter, and his wife. Introduced in 1860.

Apples & Fruiting Crabapple Standard

33348-Burgundy- \$22.99

Rootstock: Apple

Large, round, blackish red fruit with solid blush, but without stripes. Skin is smooth and glossy. Crisp, subacid flesh with red coloration. Very good eating quality. Annual bearer. Fruits hang well for three weeks after ripe. Storage is short, no more than one month.

13535-Fuji

Rootstock: Apple

Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Ripe September-October in Central Calif. Excellent pollenizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

30214-Gravenstein, Red

Rootstock: Apple

Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Ripe September-October in Central Calif. Excellent pollenizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

30034-Liberty

Rootstock: Apple

Disease-resistant, cold hardy apple. Resists scab, rust, mildew, fireblight. Solid red even in hot climate. Crisp, rich sprightly flavor. Fresh or cooked. Early fall harvest. Interfruitful with Red Delicious, Empire, McIntosh. Self-fruitful.

Colonnade Apples \$32.99

30052-Northpole

Rootstock: M7

Large, bright red, McIntosh-type fruit with tasty, crisp, juicy flesh. Compact growth habit is straight up with virtually no branching. Works well for container or in confined spaces. Pollinate with Scarlet Sentinel.

30054-Scarlet Sentinel

Rootstock: M7

Dense clusters of white blossoms followed by large, attractive greenish yellow and red fruit. Crisp, sweet, flavorful white flesh. Attractive tree with very narrow growth habit, grows about 10ft.. Productive. Disease resistant. Pollinate with Northpole.

Excellent all-around rootstock for apples. Induces early and heavy bearing. Tolerates wet soil, dry soil, poor soil. Resists woolly apple aphids and collar rot. Trees dwarfed to 85 % of standard.

Apricots Semi-Dwarf

13655-Harglow - \$22.99

Rootstock: Citation

Late-blooming, productive tree, proven in coastal Northwestern climates. Medium size, bright orange fruit sometimes blushed red. Orange freestone flesh is firm, sweet flavorful. Resistant to perennial canker, brown rot, cracking. Self-fruitful.

28272 -Puget Gold- \$24.99

Rootstock: Citation

Large, elongated, freestone fruit with very good flavor. Tree can easily be maintained at 15ft. Prolific bearer. Blooms in early March. Self fertile. Ripens in early August.

83061-TomCot- \$22.99

Rootstock: Myroc29c

The most consistently productive apricot variety at Dave Wilson Nursery 1992-97. Large, orange fruit with firm, sweet flesh. Early harvest, 2-3 weeks before Wenatchee Moorpark. Originated at Prosser, WA, introduced in 1989. 600 hours. Partly self-fruitful; biggest crops if cross-pollinated by another apricot. Pat. No. 7034.

Cherries Sweet Semi-Dwarf

27752-Bada Bing \$24.99

Rootstock: Colt

Large Bing like cherry. Purplish red flesh is firm and sweet. Best known as a 'Self Fertile Bing'. Resistant to cracking. Good pollenizer for other sweet cherries. Ripens 1-

2 weeks after Bing.

13745-Bing \$25.99

Rootstock: Colt

Large, firm, juicy, sweet, nearly black when ripe — superb flavor, the No. 1 cherry. Mid-season. Large vigorous tree. Pollinated by Black Tartarian, Van, Rainier. Also Stella in colder climates.

13750-Black Tartarian \$25.99

Rootstock: Colt

Medium-sized, nearly black, sprightly flavor, early season. Vigorous, productive tree. Pollenizer required—interfruitful with all popular sweet cherries.

13765-Craig's Crimson \$25.99

Rootstock: Colt

Self-fruitful, natural semi-dwarf, perhaps the finest sweet cherry: dark red to nearly black, medium to large size, wonderful spicy flavor, very firm texture. Mature tree size about 2/3 of standard (smaller when budded onto Colt or Mahaleb rootstock). Mid-season. Pat. No. 7320.

82362-Lapins \$25.99

Rootstock: Colt

Self-fruitful, dark red, sweet cherry. Large, firm texture, good flavor. Similar to Bing.

13785-Royal Rainier \$27.99

5-Rootstock: Colt

Large yellow cherry with slightly more red blush than Rainier. Excellent flavor, taste test winner. Ripens early, about 3 to 5 days ahead of Rainier.

13795-Stella \$25.99

Rootstock: Colt

Self-fruitful - no pollenizer needed. Large, nearly black, richly flavored sweet cherry. Similar to its parent, Lambert. Late harvest. Pollinates Bing, except in mild winter climates. 700 hours.

13805-Van \$25.99

Rootstock: Colt

Very cold hardy, reliable, heavy bearing. Fine fruit similar to Bing, though usually smaller. Pollenizer required-interfruitful with all popular sweet cherries.

Cherry's Sweet Standard

13740-Bing \$23.99

Rootstock: Mazzard

Large, firm, juicy, sweet, nearly black when ripe — superb flavor, the No. 1 cherry. Mid-season. Large vigorous tree. Pollinated by Black Tartarian, Van, Rainier. Also Stella in colder climates.

13785-Royal Rainier \$25.99

5-Rootstock: Mazzard

Large yellow cherry with slightly more red blush than Rainier. Excellent flavor, taste test winner. Ripens early, about 3 to 5 days ahead of Rainier.

33382-Utah Giant \$24.99

5-Rootstock: Mazzard

Best sweet cherry, larger, firmer, and more flavorful than Bing or Lambert. Good canner. Pollinizer required use Bing, Lambert, Rainier.

Cherry's Sour

13770-Montmorency \$22.99

5-Rootstock: Standard Mazzard

Sour Cherry. Large, light red skin, yellow flesh. Perfect for cobblers, pies, etc. Extremely winter hardy. Very heavy bearing. Self-fruitful.

Multigraft Cherry-Standard \$45.99

13735-Cherry 4-N-1 Rainer-Bing-Lapin-Van

5-Rootstock: Standard Mazzard

6-N-1 3-Tier Multigraft Esapliered Cherry \$51.99

83064-Rainier-Bing-Lapin-Van

5-Rootstock: Semidwarf M7

Cherry Plum Multigraft -Semidwarf \$32.99

13775-2-n-1 Cherry Plum Delight/Sprite

Hybrid of cherry-plum and Japanese plum. Flavorful, tangy, clingstone. Heavy crops. Very productive, even under adverse conditions.

Figs \$22.99-Potted

13845-Black Mission

The favorite. Purplish-black skin, strawberry- colored flesh, rich flavor. Heavy bearing, long-lived, large tree. Coast or inland. Fresh/dry/can. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

13855-Brown Turkey

Medium to large fruit, brownish maroon skin. Fine grained, sweet, juicy, firm, meaty flesh. Sugary, rich flavor. Excellent for jams, drying or eating fresh. Handsome, low, bushy plants can grow 10ft. tall. Self pollinating. Everbearing beginning in June.

13880-Flanders

Highly productive, violet-striped fruit with white flecks. Richly-flavored amber flesh, resistant to splitting. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

13865-King (Desert King)

Light green 'white' skin, strawberry colored pulp. Rich flavor, excellent fresh-eating quality. Large breba (spring) crop. Later crop is light in hot climates, heavier in coastal climates. Prune only lightly, occasionally. (Heavy winter pruning removes breba crop.) 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

27830-Violet de Bordeaux

Small to medium size purple black fruit with a very deep red strawberry pulp. A distinctive sweet rich flavor. Excellent fresh or dried. Sets good winter (Breba Crop). Good for containers or small space.

27834-White Genoa
